Registration for the Williams Bay School District is online only for all students through Skyward Family Access. (Step-by-step registration instructions can be found by following this <u>link</u>.)



Returning 4K-12 families should login to their Skyward Family Access to complete registration by clicking on the "2022/23 Returning" tile for the respective school This needs to be completed for each student.

New 4K-12 families should follow this <u>link</u> to request access to Skyward Family Access. Skyward will then send you your user name and password. Login to Skyward Family Access to complete registration by clicking on the "2022/23 New Student" tile for each student.





3K Program Registration should begin by following this <u>link</u> to request access to Skyward Family Access. Once you gain access to Skyward Family Access, complete registration by clicking on the arrow to the right of the house icon on the top left of the screen. You will then see the "2022-23 3K New Student" tile. Click on that tile to complete the registration.

Registration Payment using RevTrak: The link below includes instructions to help you navigate the procedure to set up a RevTrak account which is what is needed to make payments in Skyward.

- To view the fees, log into Skyward Family Access and open the tile labeled "Fees".
- 3K program registration and tuition will need to be paid via check made payable to Williams Bay School District.
 Registration is \$25. Each ½ day session is \$18. Tuition must be paid weekly. Please see the <u>3K Program Guidebook</u> for more details.

Family Hot Lunch Accounts: The free hot lunch waiver has as ended. Lunch account balances reflect the amount that is in the family account. The family amount will show up for each of your children if you have multiple children in the district. If an extra lunch or ala carte item is purchased it will be deducted from the family account and not each individual child. To pay for lunches, log into Skyward Family Access and open the tile labeled "Food Service". Click on the "Pay with RevTrak" link on the top right of the screen.

Elementary Milk Fees: Families are welcome to pay for milk for the daily milk/snack break. We will send home milk forms with students to obtain information about which students will be taking milk at snack time.

The Williams Bay School District is proud to announce that we will have a Hope Squad at both our middle school and high school in the 2022-2023 school year. A Hope Squad is a peer-to-peer suicide prevention program. The program reduces youth suicide through education, training, and peer intervention.

High School Hope Squad members were nominated by their peers during the Spring of 2022. Middle School Hope Squad members will be nominated by their peers in September of 2022. Mrs. Megan Williamson & Ms. Kassie McOmber serves as advisors to both groups. There will be monthly meetings held during the school day to teach the skills on how to recognize suicide warning signs and how to respectfully report concerns. Students will be trained how to support fellow students who may be struggling and increase connectedness and inclusion within our school buildings.

As the summer break comes to an end there are many important notes and reminders as you move into the "getting ready for school" mode. Families are invited to stop into Williams Bay

Elementary School on Tuesday, August 23 to drop off school supplies and meet their teacher(s) during our Open House between 3:45-6:45 PM.

The first day of school is September 1. We are very excited to welcome students back to school. School hours for elementary students are as follows:

Full Day 4K-5th Grade: 8:30 - 3:30
1/2 Day 4K: 8:30 - 11:30 (Parents pick up at the front doors)
3K AM: 8:30 - 11:30 (Parents pick up at the front doors)
3K PM: 12:30 - 3:30 (Parents pick up at front door for last names A-M, Fitness Center doors for N-Z)

As a reminder, the drop-off circle is at the front of the school (east side). Please enter on Theatre Road, and proceed to the circle drive. Supervision begins at 8:15. Students should be dropped off between 8:15-8:25 AM. Elementary students cannot be dropped off when middle/high school students arrive unless they are registered for Little Learners wrap around care. Students can stand in their designated lines until staff is on duty. Younger students (3K & 4K) should have an adult with them until staff is on duty. The buses and parents of children who attend before/after school care, will drop off and pick up students on the west side of the building.

Williams Bay Elementary Student Handbook Changes

The following changes were made to the 2022-2023 Williams Bay Elementary Student Handbook.

- Advance homework will not be provided for planned absences. To keep students engaged, families can have their students keep a journal of their experiences and read.
- Treats to share must be store bought but do not have to be individually wrapped.
- Elementary school students are strongly discouraged from bringing cell phones to school. Students who bring a cell phone to school will leave it in the office when they arrive to school and pick it up when they leave school each day.

The complete handbook can be accessed on the district website. Please take time to review the student handbook with your child(ren) so all are aware of the revisions to school policies, procedures and routines. Please make a special note of the attendance policy as well as the expectation that students will arrive at school on time. Students will be considered tardy if arrival is after 8:30 AM. Arrival after 8:35 AM will be considered an absence.

The Williams Bay School District is excited to welcome several new staff members this year. The administrators, staff and School Board have worked extremely hard to recruit, interview and hire high quality educators for our school community. We are confident that we have staffed our classrooms and schools with incredible professionals who will meet the academic and social needs of each student.

I have received feedback and expressions of concern from a number of parents, community members, and staff regarding the loss of some incredible educators. Many are searching to understand why staff have left the district. This is hard to answer since staff have departed the district for a variety of reasons. These include pursuing the next step in their career, working closer to home, pursuing a higher salary, the desire for a change, or simply leaving the profession to explore different career opportunities. Please know that the school board and administrators share many of the same worries and concerns. We are disappointed with employees leaving but at the same time excited about those joining our school community.

Moving forward, we recognize the teacher shortage in America has hit crisis levels — and school officials everywhere are scrambling to ensure that, as students return to classrooms, someone will be there to educate them. The issue with educators leaving the profession or electing to move to a new district is a national issue, and not specific to Williams Bay. State- and district-level reports have emerged across the country detailing staffing gaps that stretch from the hundreds to the thousands — and remain wide open as summer winds rapidly to a close. We know that many districts in Wisconsin, including local districts are still working to fill teaching positions as we near the start of the school year.

The teacher shortage will have many implications for the Williams Bay School District. Retention of staff will be a tremendous challenge as districts reach out and recruit employees from other districts. This will also have a significant impact on our budget as the shortage has escalated salaries.

I bring these issues and concerns to you so that our school community can understand the challenges facing our school district and all school districts across the state and country. The school board and administrative team will explore all options to attract and retain high quality educators so that we can maintain the level of teaching and learning we all expect.
