I. CALL TO ORDER

President Lothian called the meeting to order at 6:15 pm.

III. RECONVENE INTO OPEN SESSION

A. Pledge of Allegiance

President J. Lothian called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

IV. COMMUNICATION AND PUBLIC COMMENTS

A. Public Comments – Dr. Anderson presented Sue Vavra with the Bulldog Pride Award in recognition of her 23 years of service in the District. Mrs. Vavra's last day with the district is December 31st.

Kate Meredeth from the Greater Geneva Education Association for Sustainability and the Environment (former Director of Yerkes Education Outreach) presented information regarding the formation of the association. A handout was given to the Board outlining possible summer programs. The program offerings would be geared toward environmental education at Kiswaukeetoe and summer school for those students in grades four and five. The association is just getting started, but she wanted to provide the Board of Education with an update and will return in the future to discuss program details.

III. REPORTS

A. Student Representatives – B. Thompson reported that the Student Council was able to put together six (6) Thanksgiving food baskets for local families. The mitten tree is up with 65 ornaments. The Jazz Band performed at the Williams Bay Business Association luncheon on Thursday, December 6th. History Bowl participants attended a competition on Saturday, December 9th and had great success. G. Middle/High School Principal

Dr. White reported his notes were as written. In addition, there was some concern regarding the content of the High School musical "13" that were brought to his attention. Going forward, there will be a new practice put in place that has the High School Principal and District Administrator review the dramatic and musical selections before they are ordered. Mock Interviews for Junior Seminar were held last week and went very well. Dr. White advised the Board that the Human Growth and Development Curriculum is ready to take to be reviewed and discussed by an advisory committee. The school district staff on the committee will be himself, Bud Breen, and Tina Langnes. There will also be a pastor, two students and six parent/community members on the committee as well. It was noted that the Board members are welcome to attend the committee will be an intern from UW-Whitewater helping out in the Social Studies Department as well a student teacher for second semester. Members of the Student Council proposed "Cookies and Cram" before first semester finals, which would require teacher conferences to be changed to January 17, 2018. The proposal is for "Cookies and Cram" tutoring session from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm then Teacher Conferences from 5:45 pm to 7:15 p.m.

H. Elementary Principal

Principal Bond reported her notes were as written. She also noted that the Elementary Holiday Concerts were Friday, December 7th and went well. Mrs. Campbell did an excellent job with the students.

I. School Board – K. Granberg reported that she heard many good things regarding the Mock Interviews held last week. He stated that he just received the information regarding the assembly, will review it and have the resolutions to discuss at the next meeting.

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V. DISCUSSION ITEMS

- A. School Resource Officer Policy #882.1 Initial Draft
 - Dr. Anderson presented a draft of the School Resource Officer Policy #882.1. The policy is designed to lay out the roles and responsibilities of the School Resource Officer. The School Resource Officer is scheduled to start in the district the beginning of second semester at the end of January. A meeting was held with Dr. White, Ms. Bond and Dr. Anderson with the Williams Bay Police Department to review and collaborate on the roles and responsibilities of the SRO. Dr. Anderson also noted that there would be a Memorandum of Understanding developed between the District, Village and the Police Department which will be available for Board review prior to the next regular meeting. Discussion followed.

B. Open Enrollment Caps Discussion for the 2019 – 2020 School Year

Dr. Anderson presented the Board with the current Open Enrollment Caps for the 2018 - 2019 school year. It was noted that open enrollment in the high school grades are currently not capped. Dr. Anderson's recommendation is to keep the caps at the current level for the 2019 - 2020 school year. There are currently openings under the caps in each grade level, except third grade. Discussion followed.

C. WI Department of Public Instruction Report Cards

Dr. Anderson presented the results from the Department of Public Instructions report cards for the 2017 – 2018 school year. The elementary school was at Exceeds Expectations, the middle school was at Meets Expectations, the high school was at Exceeds Expectations and the District as a whole scored at the Exceed Expectations level. Discussion followed.

VI. PUBLIC COMMENTS

D. Woss asked when last year's students would be returning to speak to the District. Dr. White noted that the students are scheduled to talk to the Teachers and the Board together on Tuesday, January 8^{th} at 2:50 p.m.
