131 SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS

The School Board of the School District of Williams Bay shall be elected at the general Spring election following the procedure outlined for such election by the state statutes. Any person who is a United States citizen and an eligible elector of the school district is legally qualified to become a member of the Board.

Board members are elected at large for a term of three years, except as otherwise provided by law. Two members of the five-member Board are elected each year, except for every three years when one Board member is elected. Such term of office is to commence on the fourth Monday in April.

Before taking office, School Board members shall take and file the following Oath of Office with the Board Clerk:

I, the undersigned, who have been duly (elected or appointed) to the School Board of the School District of Williams Bay, Wisconsin, but have not yet entered upon the duties thereof, swear (or affirm) that I will support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of Wisconsin, and will faithfully discharge the duties of said office to the best of my ability. So, help me God.

The School District Clerk has the authority to administer the oath of office unless s/he was reelected in the spring election. A notary public or other person with authority under law to administer the oaths may also administer the oath to members.

The oath does not need to be administered at or in conjunction with a Board meeting.
