186 ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The School Board considers it advisable to enlist citizen groups to counsel the Board from time to time. Advisory committees have no power to act for the Board. The School Board reserves the right to exercise its legal duty to use judgment in all matters of decision-making. Three basic principles are followed by all advisory committees:

- 1. Citizens groups should be broadly representative;
- 2. Recommendations should be based on research and fact;
- 3. Recommendations should be submitted to the School Board, which alone has the authority to act upon the recommendations.

The Board shall have the sole power to dissolve any of its advisory committees and shall reserve the right to exercise this power at any time during the life of any committee.

Appointments

All appointments of citizens to advisory committees for the Board shall be made by the Board.

All appointments of staff members to citizens advisory committees for the Board shall be made by the District Administrator with the approval of the Board.

Public Notice

Public notice of committee meetings shall be given per state law and established procedures.
