310 ORGANIZATION OF INSTRUCTION AND INSTRUCTIONAL GOALS

The School Board of the Williams Bay School District is responsible for public education, grades 4K through 12, throughout the school district.

The grouping and housing of instructional levels in the school facility shall be according to plans developed by the District Administrator and staff and approved by the Board.

The following goals are essential for quality instruction in the Williams Bay School System:

- 1. Teachers should be assigned only to teach subjects for which they are certified.
- 2. Teaching in the classroom should take precedence over all other school activities. Interruption of classroom activities should be kept to a minimum.
- 3. Teachers should regularly re-evaluate the goals, objectives, and methods of their courses of content.
- 4. Every student should have access to excellent Instructional Media Center facilities and materials.
- 5. Adequate technology equipment and other supplies, materials, and equipment should be available for each teacher's use.
- 6. The total 4K 12 instructional programs should be reviewed regularly to determine needs for updating or otherwise altering the scope and sequence of the program offerings.
- 7. Teachers should strive to develop the following ideals in their students:
 - a. A command of the basic academic skills
 - b. Self-reliant scholarship, originality, and initiative
 - c. An appreciation and acceptance of the work ethic
 - d. Leadership and responsible citizenship
 - e. Moral and cultural values
