#### A (SPOILER-FREE) REVIEW OF BLACK PANTHER: WAKANDA FOREVER



However, everything changed on August 28, 2020 with the tragic and seemingly-sudden death of Chadwick Boseman, who passed away due to colon cancer. The world was shocked at this news, but Boseman had been fighting this cancer since 2016, when he was first diagnosed. His friends, family, and fans mourned for him: Ryan Coogler, the director of *Black Panther*, even considered leaving the industry altogether. And what Boseman's death meant for the future of the Marvel Cinematic Universe was unclear, for the script of the sequel had already been written. Fans wondered if T'Challa's character would be portrayed by another actor, but Marvel Studios President Kevin Feige decided that it "felt like it was much too soon to recast... And [he and the directors] had talked about how, as extraordinary and fantastical as [Marvel's] characters and stories are, there's a relatable and human element to everything [Marvel does]" (Freitag). So, Boseman's real-life passing would translate to T'Challa's on-screen death.

Fans were skeptical about how *Wakanda Forever* would turn out in the end. After all, the last several MCU projects (e.g. *Doctor Strange in the Multiverse of Madness, Thor: Love and Thunder, She-Hulk: Attorney at Law)* disappointed many in terms of character development, pacing, and plot. Now added to these worries were the absence of the original film's main character and a last-minute script change. The question on many fans' minds: "How can you have a Black Panther movie without the Black Panther?"

The Review

According to Disney+, the synopsis of the movie is as follows:

"Queen Ramonda, Shuri, M'Baku, Okoye and the Dora Milaje fight to protect their nation from intervening world powers in the wake of King T'Challa's death. As the Wakandans strive to embrace their next chapter, the heroes must band together with Nakia and Everett Ross to forge a new path for their beloved kingdom."

Not unexpectedly, the story of *Wakanda Forever* centers around grief for King T'Challa, and this topic alone is covered beautifully by Ryan Coogler, who often consulted Chadwick Boseman's family for guidance on how to handle his character's death. This, in combination with the cast's outstanding performances, led to a heart-wrenching portrayal of the grief that follows death on the scale of both the family and the nation. To some, this is where the movie truly shines; the first half of the movie and its exposition are key in making the rest of the story impactful.

The music in the movie is composed by Ludwig Göransson, who created the music behind the original *Black Panther* in addition to other popular works such as *Creed, Venom, and The Mandalorian*. The score is centered around African instrumentals, rhythms, and melodies, creating another layer of connection to the characters and the setting at both the movie's saddest and suspenseful moments. Rihanna is also featured in the credits with new songs "Lift Me Up" and "Born Again."

As mentioned above, the first act of the movie is arguably its best, as it combines some of the greatest elements of the Marvel franchise: heart, humor, and action. Mystery about the movie's antagonists surrounds both the characters and the audience, and the new protagonists are given a proper (though grief-stricken) introduction. As the story progresses, audiences find themselves wondering which side they're supposed to be rooting for. Visuals and chase sequences are reminiscent of that of the first movie, providing audiences with a small sense of nostalgia and reminding them of the unique style and story of Wakanda. At this point, the movie appears genuinely promising.

However, as the story continues, *Wakanda Forever* unfortunately dips into some of the pitfalls of other recent MCU projects. A new and exciting character is introduced, but they are both underwritten and underutilized in the story. There are several over-complicated subplots, namely one CIA-centered storyline that could have been cut altogether; in fact, doing so would have both made the movie more coherent and cut its 2 hours and 41-minute runtime down slightly. And, of course, there is the grandiose battle sequence at the end of the film that not even a story centered around grief can escape in the MCU (though, the fight in *Wakanda Forever* does feel more necessary than that of *WandaVision*). All of these constraints come from something that it cannot help: it is Marvel property, and must therefore carry out the narrative that the wider cinematic universe has planned, something that detracts from *Wakanda Forever's* existence as an individual body of work.

While there are some faults in the movie, they are outweighed by its successes. The visuals are on-par if not exceeding that of the first movie; Ryan Coogler's careful direction allows for beautiful shots—specifically the water effects throughout the entire movie—and the large budget gives the CGI department liberty to make sure everything looks futuristic yet authentic. The movie is co-starred by Letitia Wright and Angela Bassett—portraying Shuri and Queen Ramonda, respectively—who play their demanding roles wonderfully in all of their characters' emotions. Wright, whose character was primarily a deuteragonist for comic relief in the first installment, steps into the spotlight for Wakanda Forever, and while the transition from supporting character to protagonist does not always work, Wright's dynamic performance is enough to justify her character's significance. Other outstanding performances include those of Lupita N'yongo (Nakia), Danai Gurira (Okoye), and Tenoch Huerta (Namor), all of which bring something unique to the movie. Another accomplishment of this film—even more so than the original—is its dedication to representation: the main cast is composed primarily of Black women, and the antagonist, Namor, is the first character in the MCU with an indigenous or Mesoamerican background. Crafting this character correctly was important to Coogler, as he wanted it to be meaningful: "You can research whatever culture you want," he told Entertainment Weekly, "but if you have people from that culture and they have that knowledge and experience—not just from books, but from being alive—the approach is totally different... That's what inclusion means. It's not just putting some brown-skinned people in front of the camera or giving them an important role. It's how you're creating the movie" (Wehniainen). In comparison to other MCU projects, however, the greatest strength of this movie lies in its ability to take time to sit in its sadness.

Other writers may have chosen to simply skip forward in time to move away from the grief, or recast the character of T'Challa and continue the story as it was originally planned. Coogler instead chose to take that grief and build something from it, to ask big questions about life, loss, and legacy—to take something tragic and turn it into something transformative.

Overall, *Black Panther: Wakanda Forever* is a great film, especially in comparison to the MCU's other recent projects. Its elements of heart, humor, and action found the balance that *Thor: Love and Thunder* lacked, and its character development far surpassed that of *Doctor Strange in the Multiverse of Madness* (if any existed). While the movie still feels similar to past MCU projects with its plot points and characters required to move the massive universe forward, it also brings something new and fresh into the Marvel franchise. Rotten Tomatoes' critics rate it as a Certified Fresh 84%, while the audiences believe it deserves more, giving it an outstanding score of 95%. Taking all factors into consideration, I would personally rate this movie as an 8.5/10—if you're a fan of the MCU, it's definitely worth the watch.

## The Williams Bay Catacombs By Dylan Hulke

Few people are aware, but there are a small series of tunnels underneath the town of Williams Bay. Filled with cobwebs and potential caveins, these tunnels run from the old elementary school to the Williams Bay library, with a T-junction that branches off to the high school. While the exact purpose of these tunnels is unknown, the leading theory is that they were built during prohibition. The tunnel from the elementary school to a home near the Williams Bay library has been determined to have been built first, as the tunnel leading to the high school was not built at the time of discovery. This leads to the question: why were these tunnels expanded?

The first expedition (that we know of) into these tunnels was way back in the year of 1987-88, and led by Charles Johnson and Andy Smith, both of the graduating class of that year. While they didn't leave a large amount of information behind about what they discovered, there is no mention of a branch departing from one of the walls to the high school. How they discovered the tunnels is also unknown; however, they may have found them when they attended the elementary school and potentially had attended multiple expeditions before their final one. They noted their journey in an edition of the Bulldog Barker for that year that was recently rediscovered, saying that "The Tunnels seemingly stretched on forever, having no end to their all-encompassing darkness. The walls were cracking near the roof,


and it seemed as though they could fall apart at any moment" (Johnson, 1987). They estimated the tunnels to be roughly forty feet below the ground, just under the school's foundation.

These tunnels were lost to time after the Douglas-Orwell expedition, and only recently discovered by a member of the high school musical. This discovery took place during practice on November 7th, and was only fully realized once the rehearsal had concluded. Almost immediately, a small group was sent into the entrance of the tunnel to explore. It was found that one path led East, unknown at the time to be a direct path to the old school, and a collection of paths led to locations all over the school. These exit ways include the lecture center, teachers' lounge, maintenance closet, and the new elementary school office. The exit points are incredibly well hidden from the outside, and the only way someone would know how to get into the tunnels from them would be if they knew exactly where these entry points are. The initial journey into the tunnels only found the paths to other locations in the school, and it was unknown at the time that a larger path led to the old elementary school. Somewhat scarily, a copy of Bradley Galvin's *Time War* was almost immediately discovered upon entering the tunnel. Unlike its surroundings, this book was almost completely void of dust, implying that it had been left behind rather recently.

There was one more expedition into the tunnels on November 9th. This expedition confirmed the previously located exits/entrances, and pressed farther into the tunnels. The expedition went East, and eventually surfaced right inside the gym of the old school. The expedition resumed and followed the only remaining tunnel into a random backyard near the Williams Bay library. After the expedition surfaced, they backtracked to the high school, keeping an eye out for any more tunnels, rooms, or objects of interest. Unfortunately, nothing else was found in the system, and the expedition returned empty handed.

Sometime between 1916 and 2017, a tunnel system under the old Williams Bay elementary school was built. While it may be difficult to pinpoint an exact date, it's possible to make some assumptions about their construction date. A leading theory is that the school was expanded between 1920 and 1933, also the period of time known as prohibition. It's possible that a select few of school officials were made aware of a secret construction project, and while the legitimate expansion was taking place, an illegitimate tunnel system was being built. This proposes a very possible situation, as during prohibition, Williams Bay was home to the closest, largest distillery to Lake Geneva. This could have been a situation proposed by the Lake Geneva government to incentivize people to move there, as it had recently suffered a large population drop in the late 1910s. The promise of available liquor would have led to those in Chicago and other large cities, where, during the prohibition era, they had lots of gang violence regarding the transportation and production of alcohol moving into Lake Geneva. This seemingly worked, as during the previously stated time period, Lake Geneva had a large growth in population, returning to its previous levels. These tunnels would have been important for the distribution of liquor from the distilleries, which happened to be based nearby to the old elementary school. However, this theory would set a new record for the length of prohibition tunnels, as the longest discovered were about 150 feet long. This means it's very likely that these tunnels have some sort of alternative purpose that we are still unaware of.

While the exact purpose of these tunnels is unknown, the question remains: who has been using them?
