Q: What do you like to do in your free time?


A: I like to train my dog for agility and I have a horse so I ride my horse a lot. I also like to go hiking and bicycling with my family. I like to be outside a lot.

Drop Bugar Pookies

- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 tsp. cream of tartar
- 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ -4 $\frac{1}{2}$ c. flour
- 1 c. granulated sugar
- 1c. powdered sugar
- ¹/₂ tsp. salt
- 1 Tbs. vanilla

tsp. almond extract
c. corn oil

Roll into 1 inch balls and press with small glass onto a greased baking sheet. Dip in colored sugar and press cookie again so that the sugar sticks. 15-18 minute cook time


Favorite Holiday Movies By Vanessa Thompson
